Forgiven!

If there is one word to describe Christians, it should be this one: "forgiven." There is a range of what people (both inside and outside the church) think of when they think of a Christian, but this is at the very heart of it.

Some, especially those outside the church, assume that being a Christian means following a particular moral code. When a person does something contrary to that moral code, he/she must not be a very good Christian. The ten commandments generally forms the basis for that code, but there is often more to it. Typically, anyone who has a complaint against Christianity adds his/her pet issue to what a Christian should be and do.

But being a Christian is not about what you do or say. Being a Christian is first and foremost that which is indicated in the Rite of Holy Baptism when the pastor marks one with the sign of the cross on the forehead and heart as one "redeemed by Christ the Crucified." A Christian is one whose sin has been forgiven, paid for by Jesus on the cross. A Christian is one who has been clothed with Christ's righteousness. What one does or says does not make him or her a Christian! Only Christ can make a person a Christian, a part of His eternal kingdom.

That said, a Christian will do what Christ wants him or her to do. When a person claims to be a Christian but his works and life are an affront to the Word and works of Jesus, he is a liar (1 John 1:8).

On the other hand, even the most devout believer still sins and falls short (Romans 3:23, 7:15). Those sins do not make a person an unbeliever. They cause her to turn to Jesus and acknowledge His forgiveness of her.

Just as you, a child of God, are forgiven, you are also called to forgive (Lord's Prayer). Because you have been forgiven, you have been given what you need to forgive those who sin against you.

Rejoice! You are forgiven. You are a beloved child of God.
