Feast of Holy Innocents, Martyrs

It may seem a strange celebration so close to Christmas. We are basking in the joy that God loved us enough to come down, born of Mary, to save us. The excitement of a new birth still hangs in the air. And today, we turn our attention not only to death, but to murder, to slaughter.

This event has been marked by the church since well before the Reformation; it is perhaps one of the oldest feasts set aside in the church. Today, rather than celebrating God's action through a particular person, we recognize those children who died for no other reason than that they were boys, born in or near Bethlehem around the time that Jesus was born!

It should not surprise us that Herod would go to great lengths to kill Jesus. He was a powerful ruler, jealous of anyone who might threaten that power. When he heard from the magi that there was a "king" born in his region, he wanted to end that threat as soon as possible. So, when the magi did not report back after finding Jesus, Herod chose to kill anyone who might have been the one.

Today, we do not celebrate that those boys were killed. We mourn their deaths as we rejoice that Jesus would live to die for them and all people. Sin has a tremendous price, not only for the one who sins, but often for those around him or her. The "holy innocents" were victims of Herod's sin. The grace of God covers them, as well.

Today, we especially remember all who have died because of senseless violence. Though death remains the enemy, it has lost its sting because of Jesus' death (1 Corinthians 15:55). Death has now become the entrance into God's kingdom (2 Samuel 12:23, Job 19:25-27). Death separates those love from us, but it cannot separate them or us from God's love (Romans 8:38-39).

This day is also a reminder of suffering throughout the kingdom of God; we, too, will suffer until He returns in glory. We, too, have hope, knowing that God will bring an end to that suffering. In that, we rejoice.
