Increasing in Wisdom

In today's Gospel reading, Luke reports that "Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature and in favor with God and man." This sometimes catches people "off guard," since Jesus *is* God, and it seems odd that He would *increase* in anything!

We can look at this from several angles, but here, I will focus on the example Jesus sets for us. Though it seems like Jesus should already have been everything He could be, His example shows us that neither will our relationship with God be without room for improvement.

Simply put, no matter how strong your devotion and how deep your knowledge, you have room to grow. It is not that you will earn something from God, but you will understand and appreciate all that He has done and continues to do for you!

What can you do to increase in wisdom like Jesus? Consider what little Luke recorded about Jesus' early life. The one incident Luke recorded was of Jesus spending time in the temple. He listened and He asked questions. He was in His "Father's house." That is a place to where you can spend time as well!

The temple was destroyed in AD 70 during the destruction of Jerusalem. Paul would later remind the Corinthians that "you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you" (1Cor 3:16). Some argue that we do not need to go to church to be close to God, because He is always with us. Yet Jesus, God Himself(!), went to the temple. The church today, built on Peter's confession (Matthew 16:16), is the place where God has promised to be found – the place where He will strengthen and build up His people through His Holy Word and through His Sacramental gifts.

Going to church is not the end of growing in Godly wisdom, but it is the foundation. Start with the habit of regular attendance in God's house – both in worship and in study with other believers. That sets the stage for a life which is grounded in God's gifts of love and salvation. It even makes a difference in your relationship with those in the world around you, when the foundation of your wisdom is built on God's Word.
