The Gift of Life

January 22, 1973, the Supreme Court of the United States issued its decision in the case of “Roe v. Wade.” This is the historic date in which abortion was declared a legal right according to the United States Constitution.

Though the decision was reversed in 2022, it did not bring an end to legal abortions, but simply put the choice in the hands of the states. The high Court proclaimed that the United States Constitution does not offer or protect a “right to abortion,” but individual states could offer such protection as they saw fit. Missouri is currently torn and undecided on the issue, based on various decisions at different levels of courts.

Whether or not abortion is legal is a separate question from the morality of it. God clearly speaks against taking the life of anyone, of any age, for any reason beyond specific consequences of specific sins, for which the government is given the authority of the sword.

Scripture is clear that God is the author of all life. See especially Job 10:9ff and Jeremiah 1:5; though these authors spoke of their own lives, we recognize that their statements apply to all life. Scripture is also clear that God alone has the power of life and death (Genesis 9:6), because “God made man in his own image.”

It is appropriate always to uphold God’s gift of life, but especially as we approach the anniversary of the landmark case legalizing abortion in the United States for so many years. The number of abortions in the United States hit approximately 750,000 in the year after the 1973 decision, rising to an estimated 1.5 million per year in the early 1990s. Though the number has declined, there has still been an average of nearly 1 million abortions every year, even after the Dobbs decision.

Please pray for all those affected by abortion. Whether or not it is legal, it is sad not only for those babies who would otherwise live, but also for everyone who is faced with such a decision. Pray that God would work through His church to provide hope and help to those who think that abortion is the answer to their problems.

And laying his hands on him he said, “Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus who appeared to you on the road by which you came has sent me so that you may regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit.” ¹⁸And immediately something like scales fell from his eyes, and he regained his sight. Then he rose and was baptized; ¹⁹and taking food, he was strengthened.

For some days he was with the disciples at Damascus. ²⁰And

immediately he proclaimed Jesus in the synagogues, saying, “He is the Son of God.” ²¹And all who heard him were amazed and said, “Is not this the man who made havoc in Jerusalem of those who called upon this name? And has he not come here for this purpose, to bring them bound before the chief priests?” ²²But Saul increased all the more in strength, and confounded the Jews who lived in Damascus by proving that Jesus was the Christ.
