God's Word in You

In Colossians 3:16, Paul exhorts his readers to “Let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God.”

How does the Word of Christ dwell in you? You read and hear it on Sunday mornings, but what about the other six days of the week? Luther encouraged a plan of devotion in the morning and evening, as well as at meals. There are many “plans” for reading the Bible on a consistent basis; you can even simply read a chapter or two a day.

If listening is easier, you can find the podcast by Pastor Will Weedon, “The Word of the Lord Endures Forever” on all the major platforms. He has a 15-minute study five days of the week. He goes through one book of the Bible at a time (and you can access all of his previous episodes through various books, amassing over several years!).

It is also a blessing not only to read, but to memorize Scripture. Memorizing requires a certain amount of concentration and focus on God's Word, which is not time wasted. The more Scripture you know well and are very familiar with, the easier it is to understand and apply the rest!

Another great way of meditating on God's Word is through the singing of hymns. It does not even matter how good a singer you are! Having words set to music makes them easier to remember. Did you know that you can purchase a hymnal to keep at home? You can also create an account on app.lutheranservicebuilder.com. There, you can look up any hymn in the hymnal, and even have the computer play the melody!

If you do not regularly spend time in God's Word, why not? What can Pastor Whittle or the church do to help you as you “let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly”?
